Terms of Use for E-Resources

The Aschaffenburg University of Applied Sciences has concluded contracts with various publishers to provide you with access to a wide range of e-media such as e-books, electronic journals and newspapers. Use of these offers is only permitted within the framework of copyright law. In addition, some publishers stipulate special terms of use which you as a user must also comply with.

If you access licenced resources, you are committed to comply with the following regulations. Failure to comply with the terms of use may result in the service being blocked for the entire campus! If a claim is made against Aschaffenburg University of Applied Sciences or the UAS Library for breach of copyright or licence provisions, users are obliged to compensate for the damages claimed.

I. Terms of use for electronic resources

- Access to the content is only permitted to members of the UAS Aschaffenburg and registered library users and other authorised users of the UAS library.
- Research results, data, full texts and other content may only be used for personal or academic use and for research purposes within the framework of copyright law. The creation of copies is also only permitted within the framework of the Copyright Law.
- The following is not permitted
 - o the commercial use or utilisation of licensed content.
 - o automatic searching, indexing, creation of collections.
 - the mass or systematic downloading of research results, data, full texts and other content - e.g. entire volumes of journals.
 - o the use of specialised software (e.g. robots, spiders, crawlers, searchbots) for downloading.
 - \circ the permanent storage of licenced content in particular beyond the period of affiliation with the institution.
 - o the creation of your own private archive 'for stock'.
 - o passing on research results, data, full texts and other content to third parties, unless this is in connection with coursework to be completed.
 - o passing on access data to third parties.
 - changes to the whole or parts of the respective licenced content in particular changes to printed and digital documents, the web interface, deletion of copyright features, logos and identification features.

II. Special conditions for text and data mining (TDM)

Text and data mining comprises automated analysis processes for large quantities of texts or data in order to search and analyse them under various aspects. For example, correlations in texts and data can be recognised and trends can be derived from them.



Members of the UAS Aschaffenburg can generally use the services licensed by the university for text and data mining projects. However, the use of text and data mining is only possible – independently from Section 60d of the German Copyright Act (UrhG) - after prior consultation with the library of Aschaffenburg University of Applied Sciences and authorisation by the respective publisher. Use without authorisation may result in the publisher's product being blocked for the entire UAS Aschaffenburg.

III. Use for the training of Al

The use of electronic media licensed by the UAS Aschaffenburg for the training of AI is only permitted after consultation with the library. If required, please contact biblio(at)th-ab.de with plenty of notice so that we can coordinate the use with the relevant providers.

IV. Special conditions for the use of e-media in teaching

For legal reasons, third-party copyrighted materials may only be made available to students online via Moodle at Aschaffenburg University of Applied Sciences. (Cf. UrhG §§ 60a - 60b) Delivery via drives, websites or other technical means is not permitted.

In order to make e-media available to students in the context of teaching in a legally compliant manner, it is advisable to set up a syllabus via the UAS library or link it to Moodle.
