Content	<p>The term New Work was coined by the Austrian-American social philosopher Prof Dr Frithjof Bergmann at the end of the 1970s. Today, it describes the structural change in our working world. The reasons for this include digitalisation, globalisation and the development of artificial intelligence, which open up completely new opportunities and possibilities in the execution and organisation of work.</p> <p>Depending on the current culture and structure of a company, New Work can mean a radical rethink or already be part of everyday life. The following factors play a decisive role in New Work:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Open innovation ▪ Work-life blending ▪ Cross-hierarchical participation ▪ Cooperation ▪ People at the centre ▪ Mindfulness ▪ Culture of sharing <p>Students work agilely on a project topic and use various AI solutions available on the market to increase their own efficiency and performance quality. In addition, various methods of self-organisation and reflection are used to increase dialogue skills and resilience.</p>
