Objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Everyday Communication Learners will be able to express their needs and respond appropriately in everyday situations such as shopping or visiting places. ▪ Sentence Building and Expression Using basic grammar and vocabulary, learners can construct correct and varied sentences. ▪ Listening and Speaking Learners understand and use common expressions and sentences used in real-life situations. ▪ Reading and Writing Learners can read short texts and write simple sentences independently. ▪ Pronunciation and Intonation Learners practice natural pronunciation and intonation to communicate clearly. ▪ Cultural Understanding Topics such as family, numbers, and etiquette help deepen learners' understanding of everyday Korean culture and allow them to engage more easily with Korean media, such as dramas and K-pop.
Content	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ This course is designed for learners who have already studied Hangul (the Korean alphabet) and basic grammar or have completed Korean I. The focus is on expanding commonly used expressions and grammar for everyday life. ▪ Various practical topics are covered, such as family relationships, native Korean and Sino-Korean numbers, location expressions, days of the week, and time, enabling learners to use Korean naturally in different situations. ▪ Each unit includes vocabulary quizzes and practical dialogue exercises to reinforce learning and apply it in real-life contexts. ▪ Reading short texts and simple writing activities help improve reading and writing skills simultaneously. ▪ The course also introduces Korean cultural topics such as family culture, etiquette, and traditional holidays to deepen understanding of the language and culture.
International applicability	Learning the Korean language enables students to use it for academic studies, business activities, and cultural exchanges in Korea and other Korean-speaking regions. Additionally, it enhances communication skills in international settings.
